

#### **ABOUT BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS**

BBBS is the largest and most replicated mentoring programme in the world. It has been running internationally since 1904 - and it works. Mentors help form strong positive relationships with young people that express care, challenge growth, share power, and expand possibilities. As a result, mentees have experienced improved academic and interpersonal outcomes. Over the last 25 years, across Aotearoa, we have matched over 3,500 taiohi with a trained mentor.

#### POST-CYCLONE NEED

People across all of our communities have been disrupted by Cyclone Gabrielle. Mentors, matches and the wider community have pulled together to look after each other during this time. But the need has increased. There has been an influx of new mentee referrals and not enough mentors to match with them. Research from New Zealand and overseas shows that there is a long 'tail' to disaster events, particularly for young people. It is a time when having a positive, stable relationship is more important than ever. It is also a difficult time for new mentors to volunteer. Barriers from travel, petrol costs and personal stress and uncertainty have increased.

We believe that working together, we can make it easier, and better serve youth in Hawke's Bay.



#### PARTNERING WITH HAWKE'S BAY SCHOOLS & BUSINESSES

Our new partnership programme aims to make it easier for mentors to volunteer, and for community to support our taiohi in need. Partner businesses empower one or two of their employees to volunteer as mentors for a couple of hours a week at the end of the school day at a local partner primary school.

#### School benefits:

Partner schools are able to help link students needing extra support to trusted adult role models. Schools report better engagement and attitude from students enrolled in the mentor programme.

#### Taiohi/Young person benefits:

Improved relationship skills, social awareness, increased self-confidence, hope and optimism.

Businesses are able to build and strengthen close relationships with their local school communities while contributing to a proven and effective programme happening locally. Empowering employee volunteering is one way to bring business values to life, improve job satisfaction and employee retention.
